Samples from The Flying Dutchman showed how the seeds of future material were to emerge in the later mature music dramas. Tahu demonstrated now the Tristan Chord goes through many iterations during the course of the opera and talked about Schopenhauer's profound influence on Wagner and his approach to music. Altogether, an excellent afternoon.
