Christmas Concert & Party, 19 November 2017


2.00pm: Concert by artists supported by Wagner Society followed by Christmas Party

As usual we were treated to a wonderful Christmas concert, on Sunday 19 November, this time with a program hastily altered to slot in Rebecca Moret, who kindly consented to replace a voice-less, indisposed Phoebe Humphreys.

Francis Greep, our very talented accompanist, juggled items and we had a wonderful time listening to one of our favourite Society dramatic sopranos, **Laura Scandizzo**, (who has been singing in the Opera Australia chorus) sing *Es gibt ein Reich* and *Ebben, ne andrò lontano*, both of which she had sung to the German President the week before, as well as *Dich, teure Halle*. **Rebecca Moret**, a former Pacific Opera young artist and Opera Australia Schools company artist, sang *Einsam in Trüben Tagen* and *Ritorna vincitor*! **Sitiveni Talei**, also in the chorus of Opera Australia, sang *Largo al factotum* and *Avant de quitter ces lieux* and finished the concert with a funny duet with Laura "We love the Opera!".

All our artists were presented as usual with Brangayne wines, kindly supplied by Brangayne Wines of Orange, and the afternoon ended with champagne and Christmas fare and the obligatory raffle, with great prizes, CDs from Universal Music, double theatre and concert passes and a special prize of high tea with Travelling Tenor artists, Helen Sherman and Adam Player, appearing in Pinchgut Opera's 'Coronation of Poppea'.

PERFORMER BIOGRAPHIES LAURA SCANDIZZO

LAUKA SCANDIZZO Laurá's operatic roles include Ariadne in Ariadne auf Naxos, and the recently performed role of Donna Anna in *Dan Giovanni* in Stara Zagara, Bulgaria at the Varna International Opera Academy in June 2017. She has performed with the Opera Australia chorus in King Rager; Handa Opera on Sydney Harbour's Cormen; The Nixon Tapes, presented for the Vivid Festival; and the Verai Requiem.

Laura is a Pacific Opera Young Artist for 2017 and through that association she was honoured to have the opportunity to perform for the German President Frank Walter Steinmeier and his wife during their recent visit to Australia.

REBECCA MORET

ADBCOA MOREL Originally from Melbourne, Rebecca is currently based in Sydney where in 2016 she debuted as Giorgetha in Taborro, the title role of Suor Angelica and covered the title role of Madama Butterfly with Opera Projects Sydney.

Rebecca was a 2016 Young Artist with Pacific Opera and after working with the Opera Australia Schools Company in 2014, she has been performing as a casual member of the Opera Australia Chorus. In 2015 she received the Debarah Riedel Prize in the Joan Sutherland & Richard Bonynge Faundation Bel Conto Award.

STIVENI TALE! Australian-born, Sitivani spent his childhood in Fiji, his father's hame country. Siti became a Young Arrist at West Australian Opera and performed Ford (Falstaff), Pooh-Bah (The Mikado), Morales (Carmen), Atesio (La Sanambulo), Belcore (Clesist' d'amare), Antonia (La nozze di Figaro), Jake Wallace (La Fanciulla del West), Yamadori (Madama Butterft), a Sailor (The Love of the Nightingale) and understudied mojor roles in Rigoletto, Die Zauberflöte, II Barbiere di Siviglia and Aida.

Sitiveni won the Marianne Mathy Scholarship (2008) and was awarded the Nelly Apt Scholarship. He moved to Sydney to join the Opera Australia Chorus in 2011.

FRANCIS GREEP Francis has an international reputation as a vocal coach and pianist, gaining experience at Opera Australia, West Australian Opera and Houston Grand Opera. He has prepared singers and choruses in more than 60 operas and has extensive experience of Art Song across all languages.

Francis is known for preparing established and developing singers for their role debuts, working in Europe, North and South America, New Zealand and Australia. He is guest vocal coach with the Song Company and this year prepared Pelleas et Mélisande with Charles Dutoit and the SSO.

Concurrently, Francis is Development and Communications Manager at the world-renowned Gondwana Choirs.
