PROFESSOR EMERITUS COLIN MACKERRAS AO FAHA

Born in Sydney, Colin is an Australian sinologist, Emeritus Professor at Griffith University, & specialist in Chinese culture. He has published on Chinese drama, national minorities of China, Australian-Chinese relations & images of China in the West. With an M.A. degree from the University of Cambridge, in 1964 he went with his wife. Alvce Mackerras, to China for the first time, where their first son was born. He taught in Beijing until 1966 at the Foreign Language Institute (now Beijing Foreign Studies University), returning in 1986, 2005, 2006-07, 2008-09, 2010 & 2011-12. He was awarded a Doctor Of Philosophy by the Australian National University in 1970. He was Chair Professor &

Research Scholar at the Australian National University in 1966–1969. He was Professor at the School of Modern Asian Studies at Griffith University in 1974–2004. At Griffith he served as Chair, School of Modern Asian Studies (1979–1985) & as Head of School of Modern Asian Studies (1988–1989, 1996–2000). Since 2004 he has been Professor Emeritus at the Department of International Business & Asian Studies (Griffith University). He is a member of the Asian Studies Association of Australia (President, 1992–95) & Chinese Studies Association (President, 1991–93). One recent scholar, Liu Siyuan, said that Mackerras' scholarship on theatre in China made him a founder of the field and successor to A.C. Scott, and praised as "an historian whose extensive scholarship on Chinese theatre forms part of his wide-ranging publications on Chinese and Asian history." Liu went on to say that Mackerras is "rightly hailed as rivaling some of the most outstanding Chinese & Japanese scholars in the past century."

He is twin brother of Malcolm Mackerras, a psephologist, & brother of the conductor **Charles Mackerras** (1925–2010) & the barrister & social campaigner Neil Mackerras (1930–1987). Colin is the current Vice President of the **Wagner Society in Queensland**.
